OPENING SENTENCES *Psalm 95:1–2; 100:4–5; 147:1, 7*

- P: Oh come, let us sing to the Lord; let us make a joyful noise to the rock of our salvation!
- C: Let us come into His presence with thanksgiving; let us make a joyful noise to Him with songs of praise!
- P: Praise the Lord! For it is good to sing praises to our God; for it is pleasant, and a song of praise is fitting.
- C: Sing to the Lord with thanksgiving; make melody to our God on the lyre!
- P: Enter His gates with thanksgiving, and His courts with praise! Give thanks to Him; bless His name!
- C: For the Lord is good; His steadfast love endures forever, and His faithfulness to all generations.

CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

- P: I will go to the altar of God,

- P: If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.
- C: Our help is in the name of the Lord, who made heaven and earth.
- P: Let us then confess our sins to God, our gracious Father.

- P: God has promised forgiveness to those who repent of their sins and turn to Him for grace. Therefore, as a called and ordained servant of my Lord Jesus Christ, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the ☒ Son and of the Holy Spirit. The Lord keep you steadfast in the Holy Spirit, lead you to greater faith and obedience, grant you a spirit of ongoing thankfulness, and finally bring you to live with Him forever, through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

SHARING OF THE PEACE

CATECHISM

- P: Confessing faith and expressing thanks are completely linked together. In the Small Catechism, Martin Luther underscored the theme of thankfulness in his explanation of the First Article of the Creed, which focuses on God the Creator. Together we say:
- C: I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth.
- P: What does this mean? I believe that God has made me and all creatures; that He has given me my body and soul, eyes, ears, and all my members, my reason and all my senses, and still takes care of them.
- C: For all this it is my duty to thank and praise, serve and obey Him.

- P: He also gives me clothing and shoes, food and drink, house and home, wife and children, land, animals, and all I have. He richly and daily provides me with all that I need to support this body and life.
- C: For all this it is my duty to thank and praise, serve and obey Him.
- P: He defends me against all danger and guards and protects me from all evil. All this He does only out of fatherly, divine goodness and mercy, without any merit or worthiness in me.
- C: For all this it is my duty to thank and praise, serve and obey Him. This is most certainly true.

OLD TESTAMENT READING *Deuteronomy 8:1–10* (A call to remember the goodness of the Lord)

[1] "The whole commandment that I command you today you shall be careful to do, that you may live and multiply, and go in and possess the land that the LORD swore to give to your fathers. [2] And you shall remember the whole way that the LORD your God has led you these forty years in the wilderness, that he might humble you, testing you to know what was in your heart, whether you would keep his commandments or not. [3] And he humbled you and let you hunger and fed you with manna, which you did not know, nor did your fathers know, that he might make you know that man does not live by bread alone, but man lives by every word that comes from the mouth of the LORD. [4] Your clothing did not wear out on you and your foot did not swell these forty years. [5] Know then in your heart that, as a man disciplines his son, the LORD your God disciplines you. [6] So you shall keep the commandments of the LORD your God by walking in his ways and by fearing him. [7] For the LORD your God is bringing you into a good land, a land of brooks of water, of fountains and springs, flowing out in the valleys and hills, [8] a land of wheat and barley, of vines and fig trees and pomegranates, a land of olive trees and honey, [9] a land in which you will eat bread without scarcity, in which you will lack nothing, a land whose stones are iron, and out of whose hills you can dig copper. [10] And you shall eat and be full, and you shall bless the LORD your God for the good land he has given you. (ESV)

EPISTLE Romans 1:18-21 (God's Wrath on Unrighteousness)

- [18] For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men, who by their unrighteousness suppress the truth. [19] For what can be known about God is plain to them, because God has shown it to them. [20] For his invisible attributes, namely, his eternal power and divine nature, have been clearly perceived, ever since the creation of the world, in the things that have been made. So they are without excuse. [21] For although they knew God, they did not honor him as God or give thanks to him, but they became futile in their thinking, and their foolish hearts were darkened. [22] Claiming to be wise, they became fools.

- C: Thanks be to God.

VERSE *Psalm* 145:15–16

- L: Alleluia. The eyes of all look to You, O Lord, and You give them their food in due season.
- C: You open Your hand and satisfy the desire of every living thing. Alleluia

HOLY GOSPEL *Luke 17:11–19*

(One leper of ten healed shows gratitude to Jesus.)

- P: The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the seventeenth chapter.
- C: Glory to You, O Lord.
- [11] On the way to Jerusalem he was passing along between Samaria and Galilee. [12]
 And as he entered a village, he was met by ten lepers, who stood at a distance [13] and lifted up their voices, saying, "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us." [14] When he saw them he said to them, "Go and show yourselves to the priests." And as they went they were cleansed. [15] Then one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice; [16] and he fell on his face at Jesus' feet, giving him thanks. Now he was a Samaritan. [17] Then Jesus answered, "Were not ten cleansed? Where are the nine? [18] Was no one found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner?" [19] And he said to him, "Rise and go your way; your faith has made you well."
- P: This is the Gospel of the Lord.
- C: Praise to You, O Christ.
