**GREETING**

**P: The grace of our Lord ✠ Jesus Christ and the love of God and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all.**

**C: Amen**

**P: Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord.**

**C: Hosanna to the Son of David.**

**PRAYER**

**P: Let us pray.**

**Most merciful God, the people of Jerusalem greeted Your dearly beloved Son with palms in their hands and acclaimed Him as King when He came into His Holy City.**

**C: Bless these palms and those who bear them, and grant that we ever hear His voice above the din of this world and follow Him in the way that leads to eternal life;**

**P: through the same Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.**

**C: Amen.**

**PROCESSIONAL GOSPEL**    *John 12:12–19*    (Jesus enters Jerusalem.)

**L:** The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the twelfth chapter.

**C:** Glory to You, O Lord.

**L:** The next day the large crowd that had come to the feast heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem. So they took branches of palm trees and went out to meet Him, crying out,

**C:** “Hosanna! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord, even the King of Israel!”

**L:** And Jesus found a young donkey and sat on it, just as it is written,

**C:** “Fear not, daughter of Zion; behold, your king is coming, sitting on a donkey’s colt!”

**L:** His disciples did not understand these things at first, but when Jesus was glorified, then they remembered that these things had been written about Him and had been done to Him. The crowd that had been with Him when He called Lazarus out of the tomb and raised him from the dead continued to bear witness. The reason why the crowd went to meet Him was that they heard He had done this sign. So the Pharisees said to one another,

**C:** “You see that you are gaining nothing. Look, the world has gone after Him.”

**PROCESSIONAL PSALM**                      *Psalm 118:19–26; antiphon: vv. 25–26*

**P:** Hosanna!

**C:** Hosanna! Save us, we pray, O LORD!  
O LORD, we pray, give us success!

**P:** Blessed is He who comes in the name of the LORD!

**C:** We bless You from the house of the LORD.

**P:** Open to me the gates of righteousness,

**C:** that I may enter through them and give thanks to the LORD.

**P:** This is the gate of the LORD;

**C:** the righteous shall enter through it.

**P:** I thank You that You have answered me

**C:** and have become my salvation.

**P:** The stone that the builders rejected

**C:** has become the cornerstone.

**P:** This is the LORD’s doing;

**C: it is marvelous in our eyes.**

**P: This is the day that the LORD has made;**

**C: let us rejoice and be glad in it.**

**L: Let us now make confession of our sins to God, our heavenly Father.**

**O Lord, who on this day entered the rebellious city that later rejected You: we confess that our wills are as rebellious as Jerusalem's, that our faith is often more show than substance, that our hearts are in need of cleansing.**

**C: Have mercy on us, Son of David, Savior of our lives. Help us to lay at Your feet all that we have and all that we are, trusting You to forgive what is sinful, to heal what is broken, to welcome our praises, and to receive us as Your own.**

**L: Merciful God, as we enter Holy week, turn our hearts again to Jerusalem, and to the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Stir up within us the gift of faith that we may not only praise Him with our lips, but may follow Him in the way of the cross.**

**DECLARATION OF GRACE**

**L: Brothers and sisters in Christ, Our God "does not treat us as our sins deserve or repay us according to our iniquities. For as high as the heavens are above the earth, so great is his love for those who fear him; as far as the east is from the west, so far has he removed our transgressions from us" (Psalm 103:10-12). Receive His Love and Forgiveness! "There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ**

Jesus” (Romans 8:1). Let us therefore walk in the light of His forgiveness; in the name of the Father, and of the +Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

THE OLD TESTAMENT READING for Palm Sunday is from *Deuteronomy, chapter 32.*  
(32:36–39)

For the LORD will vindicate his people  
and have compassion on his servants,

when he sees that their power is gone  
and there is none remaining, bond or free.  
Then he will say, 'Where are their gods,  
the rock in which they took refuge,  
who ate the fat of their sacrifices  
and drank the wine of their drink offering?  
Let them rise up and help you;  
let them be your protection!

“See now that I, even I, am he,  
and there is no god beside me;  
I kill and I make alive;  
I wound and I heal;  
and there is none that can deliver out of my hand.

L: This is the Word of the Lord.

C: Thanks be to God.

The EPISTLE of St Paul to the Philippians, chapter 2.

*(Philippians 2:5–11)*

Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

L: This is the Word of the Lord.

C: Thanks be to God.

VERSE *Philippians 2:8b*

L: Christ humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death,  
C: even death on a cross.

GOSPEL *John 12:20–43*

L: The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the twelfth chapter  
C: Glory to You, O Lord.

Now among those who went up to worship at the feast were some Greeks. So these came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and asked him, "Sir, we wish to see Jesus." Philip went and told Andrew; Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. And Jesus answered them, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Truly, truly, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. Whoever loves his life loses it, and whoever hates his life in this world will keep it for eternal life. If anyone serves me, he must follow me; and where I am, there will my servant be also. If anyone serves me, the Father will honor him.

"Now is my soul troubled. And what shall I say? 'Father, save me from this hour'? But for this purpose I have come to this hour. Father, glorify your name." Then a voice came from heaven: "I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again." The crowd that stood there and heard it said that it had thundered. Others said, "An angel has spoken to him." Jesus answered, "This voice has come for your sake, not mine. Now is the judgment of this world; now will the ruler of this world be cast out. And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself." He said this to show by what kind of death he was going to die. So the crowd answered him, "We have heard from the Law that the Christ remains forever. How can you say that the Son of Man must be lifted up? Who is this Son of Man?" So Jesus said to them, "The light is among you for a little while longer. Walk while you have the light, lest darkness overtake you. The one who walks in the darkness does not know where he is going. While you have the light, believe in the light, that you may become sons of light."

When Jesus had said these things, he departed and hid himself from them. Though he had done so many signs before them, they still did not believe in him, so that the word spoken by the prophet Isaiah might be fulfilled:

"Lord, who has believed what he heard from us,  
and to whom has the arm of the Lord been revealed?"

Therefore they could not believe. For again Isaiah said,

"He has blinded their eyes  
and hardened their heart,  
lest they see with their eyes,  
and understand with their heart, and turn,  
and I would heal them."

Isaiah said these things because he saw his glory and spoke of him. Nevertheless, many even of the authorities believed in him, but for fear of the Pharisees they did not confess it, so that they would not be put out of the synagogue; for they loved the glory that comes from man more than the glory that comes from God.
