CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION Hebrews 9:11–12

P: Brothers and sisters in Christ, we have come together intending to receive our Lord Jesus Christ's body and blood in, with, and under the bread and wine of the Lord's Supper. The Sacrament provides comfort for troubled hearts and freedom from the wrath we deserve.

When we look at our lives and conduct, though, we find sin and rebellion. Worse, we cannot free ourselves by our own strength. "But when Christ appeared as a high priest . . . He entered once for all into the holy places . . . by means of His own blood, thus securing an eternal redemption."

Let us therefore confess our sins to our heavenly Father, imploring Him for the sake of His Son, Jesus Christ, to grant us forgiveness.

- P: O almighty God,
- C: merciful Father, I confess that I am a poor, miserable sinner. I have sinned in my thinking, speaking, and acting. Even my repentance often lacks sincerity for I continue to do the very things that offend You and my neighbors.

I need deliverance but am too weak to overcome my sinful nature, the world's influence, and Satan's deceptive traps. I deserve Your punishment here in time and hereafter in eternity. In Your boundless mercy, hear my prayer for rescue and for the sake of Your Son's giving Himself over to suffering and death on my behalf, be merciful to me, a poor, sinful being.

- P: God be merciful to you and strengthen your faith.
- C: Amen.
- P: Do you believe that the forgiveness I speak is not my forgiveness but God's?
- C: Yes.
- P: Let it be done for you as you believe. In the stead and by the command of my Lord Jesus Christ I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the

 Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Amen.
- P: Now may the God of peace Himself sanctify you completely, and may your whole spirit, soul, and body be kept blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. He who calls you is faithful; He will surely do it. Go in ♠ peace.

The OLD TESTAMENT READING for our Holy Thursday Service is from the Book of Exodus, chapter 24. (Exodus 24:3–11)

Moses came and told the people all the words of the LORD and all the rules. And all the people answered with one voice and said, "All the words that the LORD has spoken we will do." And Moses wrote down all the words of the LORD. He rose early in the morning and built an altar at the foot of the mountain, and twelve pillars, according to the twelve tribes of Israel.

And he sent young men of the people of Israel, who offered burnt offerings and sacrificed peace offerings of oxen to the LORD. And Moses took half of the blood and put it in basins, and half of the blood he threw against the altar. Then he took the Book of the Covenant and read it in the hearing of the people. And they said, "All that the LORD has spoken we will do, and we will be obedient." And Moses took the blood and threw it on the people and said, "Behold the blood of the covenant that the LORD has made with you in accordance with all these words."

Then Moses and Aaron, Nadab, and Abihu, and seventy of the elders of Israel went up, and they saw the God of Israel. There was under his feet as it were a pavement of sapphire stone, like the very heaven for clearness. And he did not lay his hand on the chief men of the people of Israel; they beheld God, and ate and drank.

C: He has commanded His covenant forever.

P: Having loved His own who were in the world,

C: He loved them to the end.

HOLY GOSPEL Luke 22:14–20 (Institution of the Lord's Supper)

L: The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the twenty-second chapter.

C: Glory to You, O Lord.

And when the hour came, he reclined at table, and the apostles with him. And he said to them, "I have earnestly desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer. For I tell you I will not eat it until it is fulfilled in the kingdom of God." And he took a cup, and when he had given thanks he said, "Take this, and divide it among yourselves. For I tell you that from now on I will not drink of the fruit of the vine until the kingdom of God comes." And he took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to them, saying, "This is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me." And likewise the cup after they had eaten, saying, "This cup that is poured out for you is the new covenant in my blood.

L: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

C: Praise to You, O Christ.
