P: In the beginning was the Word, the Logos

C: and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.

- P: The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.
- C: The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world.

CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION Titus 2:11–14

- P: St Paul writes to St Titus: "For the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation for all people, training us to renounce ungodliness and worldly passions, and to live self-controlled, upright, and godly lives in the present age." As we gather together this Christmas Midnight, let us confess our sins to God our Father, seeking His forgiveness and blessing.
- P: Lord God,
- C: Pour out Your Holy Spirit upon us and deliver us from all evil. Open our eyes to see how we are broken and do not live in healthy relationship with You or with our neighbors. Guide our confession through the Holy Spirit, that we may return to You through the redemption we have in Jesus, God with us. Grant us peace as we wait for the glorious second appearance of Your only-begotten Son, the Logos made flesh and dwelling among us, whose birth we celebrate this night and in whose life we are joined as we commune with Him in bread and wine, His true body and blood, given for our sins.
- P: Family of faith, born not of flesh but of water and the Spirit, our God is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love; and out of that love God sent Jesus Christ to die for us that we may be restored to life through His sacrificial life and death and raised to new life in Him.

Therefore, as Isaiah proclaimed, as Mary and Elizabeth proclaimed, as Simeon and Anna proclaimed, so too, can we proclaim to one another now:

- P: In the name of the Father and of the X Son and of the Holy Spirit.

He is the radiance of the glory of God and the exact imprint of his nature, and he upholds the universe by the word of his power. After making purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high, having become as much superior to angels as the name he has inherited is more excellent than theirs.

For to which of the angels did God ever say, "You are my Son, today I have begotten you"? Or again, "I will be to him a father, and he shall be to me a son"?

And again, when he brings the firstborn into the world, he says, "Let all God's angels worship him."
